

Admission Procedure

The University invites applications for admission to various courses from eligible candidates through advertisement sometime in month of January. The University holds Common Entrance Test for various courses in accordance with the schedule announced by the University. The results of Common Entrance Tests are displayed on the University Website www.ipu.ac.in. The University declares the ranks for qualified candidates only. Admissions to various courses are made by the University through two centralized counsellings held in the GGSIP University Campus as per schedule and the procedure prescribed.

Admissions are conducted strictly on a merit basis through the Common Entrance Test (CET) organized by Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) or the Common University Entrance Test (CUET). The University facilitates centralized counseling for all affiliated colleges, where students are required to select their preferred college/institute based on their rank.

All applicants must appear for the CET or CUET conducted by the university. Admissions are granted based on merit and rank achieved in the entrance exam.

Intake and Reservation of Seats

The institute offers an approved intake of 100 seats for the B.Ed. program, as per GGSIP University guidelines. Reservation of seats is in accordance with the university's policies.

Eligibility Criteria for B.Ed.

The B.Ed. program is a two-year course since 2015. our institute has maintained a highly qualified teaching team under excellent leadership. The dedication of the principal and faculty is reflected in the excellent performance of students, making the institute one of the most sought-after in GGSIP University.

Minimum Academic Requirements:

- **Bachelor's Degree:** Candidates must have a Bachelor's degree in Humanities, Commerce, or Science with a minimum of 50% aggregate marks from a recognized university. Additionally, they should have studied one of the following subjects:
 - **At the Graduate Level:** English, Hindi, Integrated Science, Social Science, Mathematics.
 - **At the Postgraduate Level:** English, Hindi, Mathematics, Life Science, Political Science, Geography, History, Economics, Accountancy, Business Studies.
- **B.A. (Hons)/B.Sc. (Hons) Students:** A minimum of 50% aggregate marks is required in the main examination (excluding qualifying subjects), and 45% marks in the subsidiary subjects.
 - **Note:** Students from the B.A. (JMC) program are not eligible to choose Commerce/Business Studies/Accountancy as teaching subjects, as these subjects are not taught at the elementary or secondary level in schools.

Important Guidelines:

- The institute strictly adheres to the NCTE norms for B.Ed. admissions.
- Candidates are advised not to select two languages as teaching methodology subjects.
- The choice of teaching methodology subjects must be based on the subjects studied at the undergraduate or postgraduate level.
- Candidates must have passed at least two teaching subjects as per the subjects listed above at the graduation or postgraduation level.
- The second teaching subject can be selected from either the main or subsidiary subjects studied at the undergraduate or postgraduate level.
- Candidates who have studied Political Science, History, Geography, Psychology, or Economics are eligible to choose Social Science as one of their teaching subjects.

Special Notes for Postgraduate Students:

- The first teaching subject must be the one passed at the postgraduate level.
- The second teaching subject can be selected from either the main or subsidiary subjects passed at the undergraduate level.

Scheme of Examination

The student will be required to earn 122/120 credits for the award of the degree.

The student will have the option to choose NSS/NCC if they so desire. a)

The Two year B.Ed. Programme is of 122 credits for students opting for NSS/NCC and of 120 credits for students not opting for NSS/NCC.

a)The students will have to earn all the credits.

b) The medium of instruction shall be English.

c) In a Four credit course, three credits are assigned for theory and one credit for practical assignments or field work.

d) In a Two credit course, one credit is assigned for theory and one credit for practical assignments or field work.

e) In a theory course, one credit is equivalent to one hour of teaching.

f) In the practical course, one credit is equivalent to two hours of engagement in teaching and learning.

g) For a Practical course, weightage is of 100 marks and the ratio of External and Internal assessment of marks is 60:40.

h) For passing in any course, minimum 40% marks are required to be secured.

i) The maximum duration of completion of the B.Ed. Course will be $n+2$ ($n=2$ i.e. the existing duration of the programme). The student will be required to earn 122/120 credits for the award of the degree.

The student will be required to register in all the courses listed in the scheme of the examination of the programme.
