

Tandon who was a great philanthropist, an eminent teacher and a wonderful visionary who dreamed of entering the field of education for imparting quality school and higher education to the people of Delhi, in general, and West and South Delhi in particular, at an affordable expense. Keeping in view the above facts, he made a small beginning in 1993 by establishing Kamal Model School in Mohan Garden under the aegis of Sankalpa Educational Welfare and Charitable Society (Regd.). His eldest son Dr. Ved Tandon who is a forward looking and dynamic person took up the arduous task of bringing his father's dream to reality. He, along with his incessant hard work, not only raised the school to the Level of Senior Secondary, but also qualitatively improved it. Now this school enjoys the reputation of one of the best schools in South West Delhi.

In order to promote quality higher education, he established Kamal Institute Higher Education and Advance Technology at Mohan Garden, New Delhi in 2001, which was initially affiliated to Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar. He felt that it was troublesome for students of Delhi to go out of station for seeking admission in various courses like Teacher Education, Management, Information technology and law, so he got the institute affiliated to GGSIP university, Delhi in 2009-10 for B.Ed. Programme, in 2011-12 for B.B.A(Gen.), B.C.A, B.Com. (H) in 2013-14 and B.A. (JMC) in 2019-20.

The academic performance of the students has been excellent at GGSIP University examinations. For example, out of 1000 students of B.Ed. Programme who were placed in the Rank List of the University in 2010-11, 93 students belonged to Kamal Institute. The institute has also been laying great emphasis on faculty development. Publication of the institute's journal is the first step in this direction. The students of the institute have been enthusiastically taking part in extracurricular and sports activities organized by the University and also by other Institutes and bagging top three positions thereby making all round development of their personality. 

Fostering Unity and Holistic Growth: Celebrations and Events at KIHEAT B.Ed. Department"







National Seminar on "The Indian Knowledge System"



PARTICIPATION IN SEMINAR --RASHTRIYA SANT SAMAAJ SAMMELAN





Blood Donation Camp
